### Spiritual Director's Message

Dear Ones,

How is your soul? Is it well with your soul?

Bishop Judy Craig of the West Ohio Conference United Methodist Church used to ask that question when talking with you. It makes you stop and think. It's not the same question as "How are you?"

How IS your soul? Really!?

I never cease to marvel at how God works. As we have gone through the tragedy of our Southern neighbors, we may wonder where God is in all of it.

As I read scripture, I keep finding references about how the nation of Israel recounted all the times God was present for them, and got them through the tough times. How important it is to remember His presence with us.

As I was praying, I felt led to a book I enjoy from time to time, "Then Sings My Soul" by Robert J. Morgan. It's a book of 150 Hymns and the stories about how they were written.

The story I read talked about a wealthy attorney, Horatio G. Spafford,

a man heavily invested in real estate during the time of the Chicago fire of 1871 that leveled the city. He nearly lost everything. In that same year his son, age four, died of scarlet fever. Deciding not to become defeated, he helped rebuild the city and provided housing for those he could, since nearly 100,000 people were left homeless. Sound familiar?

Two years later, he wanted to vacation in Europe with his wife and four daughters. He booked passage on a ship for all of them. When the time came to depart, he had to stay in New York City for business. He sent his wife and children on ahead, saying he would take the next available ship and meet them.

While at sea, the ship they were on was struck by another vessel goring a hole in the side. 226 people perished. When he received the cabled message from his wife that she survived alone, he booked passage on the next ship to meet her.

When the ship moved over the waters where his four daughters lost their lives, the captain pointed it out to him.

Upset, Horatio returned to his cabin. Unable to sleep, he said to himself, "It is well, the will of God be done."

Years later those words inspired him to write, "It is Well with My Soul." At the risk of breaking a copy write law, I want to share the first verse with you.

"When peace like a river, Attendeth my way, When sorrows, Like sea billows roll; Whatever my lot, Thou has taught me to say,""It is well, It is well, with my soul."

Our cities have faced tragedies before. We have cared for those in need and rebuilt our neighborhoods. Like the Israelites we can remember those times when the Lord has seen us through difficulties. And we stand in the midst of it all, and say,""It is well, it is well with my soul!"

What ever your lot, how is your soul? Is it well with your soul?

#### Thoughts from your Lay Director

The older I get, the more I become aware of my limitations. I just finished another home project that I now know needs to be done by a professional. A lot of things in my life are like that. I would guess that there are things in your life like that too. Sometimes Emmaus is like that. I think that it is a good thing that our Emmaus community does not have to hire everything out to professionals. Instead we rely on you and me to see what our talents are; we ask God to lead us or show us what we can do.

The walk to Emmaus is designed to lift up leaders and send them back to their church home, renewed and energized to build and work in their faith communities to glorify Christ in whatever way they can. Many times this becomes a catch-22. On one hand we say go back and labor in the fields you came from; and on the other hand, we in Emmaus, find ourselves short on hands and feet to support our fields.
